

AFP MEMBERS CONDUCT PEACEBUILDING PROGRAMMING IN COUNTRIES

METHODOLOGY

Data collection of Alliance for Peacebuilding's (AfP) organizational membership was based on a manual review of each member's website, annual reports, programmatic operations, and publications.


Analysis for each relevant statistic was based upon the availability of data by organization. Member HQ Location and Member Type data was collected for the entire network. Member Organizational Size was based upon available data from 83% of AfP's network (108 organizations) and encompassed full-time/part-time employees at HQ and field offices. Member Expertise was based upon available data from 98% of AfP's network (128 organizations).

Country operations was based upon 91% of AfP's network (118 organizations) who provided country-level data on programming. Organizations who only provided regional scoping of their programming were not included. Only recent programming was considered and did not include previous efforts or past programming for country counts.

For the purposes of this report, Local Peacebuilding Organizations are those who only conduct programming within their home country. A secondary regionally local analysis was conducted for those who operate within 3 or less neighboring countries, but this did not significantly alter the results. Local Peacebuilding was defined as any organization who conducted peacebuilding within their home country, even if they operate in multiple countries.

AfP's network contains **130+ organizations** working in **181 countries** to end conflict, reduce violence, and build sustainable peace.



Member HQ Location

74% of AfP Members are based in the US, with 11% based in Europe, 5% Africa, 4% Asia, 3% Latin America,

As such, AfP's member network is primarily based in the Global North (88%) and **12% in the Global South** (Africa, Latin America, developing Asia, Middle East).

28% of AfP's network is made of local peacebuilding organizations - these are organizations who only conduct peacebuilding programming within their home country.

Member Organizational Size

AfP members are small but mighty, with 81% of organizations employing <50 employees. Only 10% of members have between 51-250 employees, 5% between 251-1000 members, and 6% have >1000 employees. In total, AfP members employ nearly 30,000 peacebuilders globally.

Member Type

AfP's network is comprised primarily of NGOs and institutions of higher education with 63% registered as non-profit NGOs, and 21% academic institutions. Our network also comprises other networks and alliances, accounting for 10% of membership. The remaining 6% is comprised of for profit institutions (5%) and foundations (1%).

Member Expertise

Member organizations work across **32 different areas of expertise** globally, reflecting the diversity and dynamism of the peacebuilding field. The top three areas of expertise reflected among member organizations are peacebuilding, education, and conflict prevention/management & resolution.
